RECENT BOOKS PUBLISHED

1. A BOOK LAUNCHED ON THE BIOGRAPHY OF JAMSETJI TATA

As Zarathushtis everywhere and most Indians know, Jamsetji Tata is proudly regarded in India and across the world as the "Father of India's Industrial Revolution". Yet, a worthwhile biography of this great man - whose contributions are unique and unparalleled among Zarathushtis anywhere in the world - had not been written until now. Russi M. Lala, a well-known Zarathushti journalist and author of many best-selling books (some so popular, that they have even been translated into Japanese), has just produced a superbly written and meticulously-researched biography: "FOR THE LOVE OF INDIA: THE LIFE AND TIMES OF JAMSETJI TATA (ISBN# 0-67-005782-7).

A person no less than the President of India, launched it on July 23. By doing so, he honoured the worldwide Zarathushti community, the author and above all, Jamsetji Tata as a person who "loved with a love that knew no bounds, the land that gave him birth". This magnificent biography insightfully explores how a man of humble birth living in the 19th century when India was firmly under British rule, implemented visionary projects which laid the foundation for his nation's industrial development once it would become independent. Jamsetji did so with the unerring instinct of a man who knew what it would take to restore the pride of his subjugated nation and prepare it for a place among the leading industrialised countries once it came into its own. A century later India became the world's 6th largest industrialised nation thanks to his far-sighted endeavours.

Thanks to Russi Lala's fascinating penmanship, the saga of Jamsetji's life and his tryst with India's destiny is now available for Zarathushtis as well as South Asians everywhere to know. Both will want to share it with their young ones, to make them aware of this unique Zarathushti and his towering national achievements. If they and their children read this biography, it can only redound by creating a great image for the community.

2. A BOOK ON PARSIS: THE ZORASTRIANS OF INDIA – A PHOTOGRAPHIC JOURNEY BY SOONI TARAPOREVALA

Sooni's book is an intimate epic. A monumental book. A twenty-four year labour of love, PARSIS is the first visual documentation of India's Parsi community, followers of the world's first prophet Zarathushtra, and the oldest monotheistic religion, Zoroastrianism. Professional photographer and award winning screenwriter Taraporevala offers a rare insider's view of how the Parsis, whose ancestors sailed from Persia to India over, 1,000 years ago to save their religion from persecution, survive today as a religious and ethnic minority of India.
